
# The Crossroads

When deciding on a room to install your cat's new furniture, consider a room they already frequent or where people gather. Most cats are social and prefer rooms like bedrooms and living rooms.


### 16" Stud Spacing


The following instructions show the process of installing the Crossroads into 4 studs spaced at 16" apart on center.



## 24" Stud Spacing


If you have studs spaced at 24" on center, you can use 3 studs to install the condo as shown below. We've marked the two mounting planks where you will need to use a 1/4" drill bit and included drywall anchors in the top two bracket holes.











Assemble each **Pole Section** by screwing them together on a **Threaded Rod** with a **Pole Connector** sandwiched between each section. Be sure to tighten each section until firm, but do not over-tighten or it can pull threaded inserts from the plastic caps. Two **Pole Sections** will be using a **Leaf Shelf** in place of the **Pole Connectors**.


